



CHILD BEHAVIOR TECHNIQUES USED AT CENTURY NURSERY SCHOOL

The staff of Century Nursery School manages child behavior using techniques based on developmentally appropriate practices including positive guidance, redirection, self discipline, positive self-esteem, and setting clear limits that encourage children to develop self-control.

Therefore, we will be following the **Deca Program Levels of Intervention**. This program addresses the universal, targeted, and expanded approaches.

- ❖ The universal approach is that each child is behaviorally equal and will be treated as such.
- ❖ The targeted approach is used when a behavior is identified as atypical and requires a more defined plan of action in dealing with said behavior. The director will meet with the parents to discuss and implement the best course of action.
- ❖ The expanded approach is applied when a behavior or developmental issue requires further evaluation. The parents will meet with the director to discuss the behavior. Once agreed upon, a request for early intervention will be sent to the behavioral consultant from the Bristol Board of Education. The consultant will observe the child and develop a plan for further intervention. If the child is not a Bristol resident, the parent can contact the behavioral consultant in their hometown who can then come to the school, observe the child, and develop a plan with Century Nursery School.

More information about the Deca Program Levels of Intervention will be given at orientation before the beginning of the school year.
